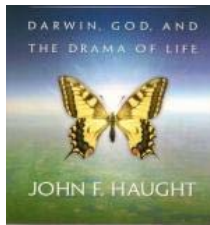




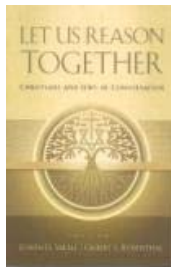

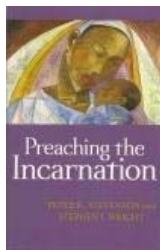
Argues for a focus on evolution as an ongoing drama within which divinity plays a purposeful and transformative role.

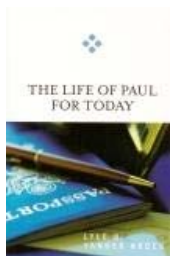
Pastors, rabbis, scholars and theologians for each faith community share their wisdom and experiences while addressing the theological concepts of the relationship God intends for these two faith communities.

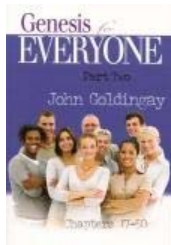
Offers a theological discussion of twelve significant Bible passages dealing with the doctrine of the incarnation.

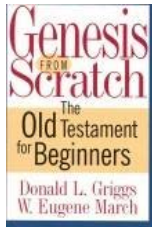
